## Maryland Manufacturing Network Website Launch

Mike Kelleher, Executive Director at Maryland MEP provided an update on the launch of the Maryland Manufacturing Network website, <a href="https://mdmep.org/maryland-manufacturing-network/">https://mdmep.org/maryland-manufacturing-network/</a>.

This new platform serves as a centralized resource for stakeholders to share information, collaborate, and stay informed about industry events. Key features include a stakeholder directory and a shared event calendar. Mike encouraged all participants to contribute content and utilize the platform to support Maryland's manufacturing sector.

# **Vehicles for Change: Donation & Training Initiatives**

Andre Cary, Chief Operating Officer at Vehicles for Change shared updates on their mission to transform lives through donated vehicles. This year, they aim to award approximately 150 cars to families in need. He encouraged stakeholders to consider donating cars, boats, RVs, or four-wheelers to support the initiative.

Mike Kelleher inquired about additional ways to engage with Vehicles for Change. Andre highlighted their innovative virtual reality training which prepares individuals for careers in automotive and machine operations.

#### **Manufacturing Programs and Updates**

 Maryland 4.0 Technology Grant: Mike Kelleher discussed recent grant winners and an increase in funding for the program. Ben McGlaughlin of Maryland Department Commerce confirmed the funding increase to \$6 million for the next round. Mike Galiazzo, President of RMI, emphasized the need for a report demonstrating the program's impact.

Maryland MADE 4.0 Program: This Department of Energy-funded initiative supports
companies purchasing energy-efficient technologies. Ben encouraged spreading the
word, as only five applications have been received so far, with support available for
12 projects. Under this program, educational webinars and events will be held to

• **TEDCO Program Updates** – Stephen Auvil and Graham Dodge of TEDCO announced the approval of SBIR Matching Program regulations and the availability of technical assistance resources on the TEDCO website. They promoted the Equitech Growth Fund, aimed at infrastructure and workforce development, particularly in rural regions. The next round of applications opens in April. Graham introduced the Concept Capital Program for early-stage startups, deploying \$25,000 - \$50,000 convertible notes at 0% interest, targeting socially and economically disadvantaged individuals and rural-based founders.

## **Other Key Discussions**

# **STEM Education & Manufacturing Day**

Ken Malone, Executive Officer at Early Charm Ventures shared plans for a partnership with a local high school STEM program to host a STEM and Advanced Manufacturing Day. The event aims to engage students and showcase manufacturing processes.

Adam Parry, Acting Supervisor for Career Technology Education in Washington County Public Schools discussed challenges in increasing student interest in manufacturing careers and sought support from manufacturers. Lee Greely from St. Mary's County offered to connect with Adam to explore collaboration opportunities.

### Youth Apprenticeship Challenges in Manufacturing

The group discussed the state of youth apprenticeship programs across Maryland. While Lee highlighted success stories in St. Mary's County, Siona reported that 20% of Washington County's youth apprentices are in manufacturing. Key challenges identified included company workload in launching programs and age restrictions due to insurance policies. Participants agreed on the need for a statewide discussion to share best practices and address common concerns.
